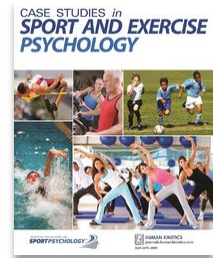


## *Case Studies in Sport and Exercise Psychology* (CSSEP)



### Open Call for Papers of Interest or Potential Special Issues

As readers of *Case Studies in Sport and Exercise Psychology* know, we strive to publish manuscripts that reflect the contemporary needs of practitioners and topical themes in applied sport and exercise psychology. The most common manuscripts focus on casework; however, we recently introduced “Invited Expert Commentary” and “In Conversation With . . .” article types to enrich the material made available in our publication. Most recently, we released a call for papers for a special issue on “Neurodiversity in Sport and Exercise Contexts,” an area that has received, at best, limited attention in research and applied practice.

Acknowledging the widening breadth of work engaged in by sport and exercise researchers and practitioners, irrespective of career stage, the need for underpinning evidence has never been so great. As such, the editorial board for *CSSEP* presents an open call for topical papers of interest and/or potential suggestions for special issues.

Interested contributors may wish to consider submitting manuscripts on topics including, but not limited to, the following:

- Working in and across interdisciplinary/interprofessional care teams
- Working with educators/coaches to promote psychology within their roles
- Applied practice and key stakeholders (e.g., agents, performance directors, sponsors)
- Enhancing performance, mental health, and well-being across performance environments
- Working with child/youth athletes
- Skill-acquisition and neuroscience approaches in practice
- Using creativity in applied practice
- Weight-management/making weight in sport and exercise environments
- Initiating and terminating client–consultant relationships
- Managing ethical, moral, and professional scenarios in professional practice
- Making (and learning from) mistakes in applied practice
- Creating constructive supervision and peer-consultation processes
